Brief Overview:

RISK ASSESSMENT SESSION: Intervention decisions should be relative to the level of concern that a child will continue to engage in CSB once they are identified. This training session will discuss risk assessment as it relates to clinical personnel conducting the assessment (e.g., clinicians, social workers, etc.) and those professionals who may contribute information to the assessment and/or have a role in implementing intervention strategies (e.g., school counsellors, day care staff, teachers, etc.).

INTERVENTION AND SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES SESSION: Based on the assessment, interventions can be targeted and specific. In this session, participants will learn to translate the assessment of risk into treatment goals and appropriate safety planning; this session will focus on how to help parents understand and provide appropriate supervision and support to children with CSB.

Target Participants: Professionals currently working with children who have a general understanding of normative sexual development and concerning child sexual behaviour.
