Dr. David Delmonico, Ph.D., N.C.C., A.C.S.

Dr. David Delmonico is a Professor at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Dr. Delmonico conducts research, consultation, and training on topics such as Internet psychology, cybersex compulsivity, cyber-offense behavior, and digital health and safety among youth. Dr. Delmonico has co-authored three books on these topics, the latest of which is titled Illegal Images. Dr. Delmonico presents nationally to treatment providers, probation/parole officers, attorneys, and various community groups on these topics. Dr. Delmonico is the Director of the Online Behavior Research and Education Center (OBREC) at Duquesne University, and Associate Editor of the Sexual Addiction & Compulsivity journal.

#cyberoffenders: Assessment, Management, & Treatment Approaches

This seminar will provide an overview of various online methods and venues where cyberoffenses commonly occur. In addition, various theories and methods for assessing, managing, and treating online problematic sexual offense behavior will be discussed. This seminar will utilize the "Cybersex User Categories" model for the conceptualization and treatment of cyberoffenders. Specific tools and techniques will be presented to assess an individual's cyber-related behavior. Instruments such as the Internet Sex Screening Test, the Internet Assessment, and the Child Abuse Material Instrument will be discussed as part of a comprehensive evaluation of cyberoffenders. In addition, practical and creative methods for management and treatment of cyberoffenders in a clinical setting will be discussed. Participants will gain new knowledge, skills, and competence in addressing cyberoffense-related issues in a clinical setting.

Dr. Michael Seto, Ph.D., C. Psych

Michael Seto, Ph.D., is a clinical forensic psychologist who currently works as the forensic research director at the Royal Ottawa Health Care Group. He is cross-appointed to the University of Toronto (Psychiatry), Ryerson University (Psychology), Carleton University (Psychology) and the University of Ottawa (Psychology & Psychiatry). Michael has presented and published extensively on the topics of pedophilia, sexual offending against children, online sexual offending, risk assessment, and mentally disordered offenders. He was appointed the Editor-in-Chief of Sexual Abuse: A Journal of Research and Treatment in 2015.

Assessment and Management of Online Sex Offenders

In this workshop, Dr. Seto will provide an overview of research on the assessment and management of online sex offenders, including a discussion of how they are similar or different from contact sex offenders, the development of a child pornography offender specific risk assessment tool, and adaptations of existing sex offender treatment programs for this newer population of offenders.

As challenging, illuminating and controversial a film as you'll see anywhere this year, Veronika Lišková's *Daniel's World* is a portrait of a young man living with one of the most stigmatized forms of mental illness there is: Daniel suffers from pedophilia. But where the term itself is enough to inspire revulsion and loathing in so many people, for Lišková it's a condition that has sentenced a man to a life of permanent celibacy, constant clinical and judicial monitoring and a constant struggle to be accepted for what he is. For Daniel, the whole point to being public with his illness is an act of social responsibility: by being transparent about his desires, he does not act on them. But what Daniel has accepted and the world accepts are two vastly separate spheres and *Daniel's World* is an account of one man's lonely campaign to navigate and bridge that distance.

Following the screening, there will a Q&A session and discussion about the film with Dr. James Cantor and Director, Veronika Lišková, who will be participating via Skype.

Director's Biography:

Veronika Lišková was born in Prague, Czech Republic in 1982. She graduated from cultural studies at Charles University, and screenwriting and dramaturgy at Academy of Performing Arts in Prague. She was the editor in chief of the Novy Prostor magazine — a popular Czech biweekly street paper sold by the homeless and low-income vendors. She has been cooperating with national Czech TV as a director and screenwriter of documentaries. She currently heads the training programme at the Institute of Documentary Film in Prague. Her feature-length debut Daniel's World had its international premiere in the Panorama section of the Berlinale — Berlin IFF in 2015.
